- Number of positions: One Professor (tenured), Associate Professor (tenured), or Lecturer (five-year fixed-term contract*)
 - *The term of lecturer is set for 5 years at the time of employment. (If you are currently working at our university and work continuously, the total term of office, from the current term to the next term, cannot exceed 10 years.) The candidate will be converted to adequate tenured status, based on the following achievements, which is to be implemented during the term.
 - (1) Educational achievements (Lecture, Practicum, Seminar, Research guidance, etc.)
 - (2) Research achievements (Research papers, Presentations at conferences, Research grants)
 - (3) Contribution to the university and society, and so on

4. Subjects to Teach:

- (1) School Courses: Fundamentals of Special Needs Education I, Education for the Motor Disability I/II, Education for the Multi-Handicapped Children I/II, Special Needs Education in Middle and High Schools I/II, Developmental Support for Illness, Disability, and Maladaptation I/II, Introduction to the Education for the Children with Special Needs I/II (Omnibus), Basic exercise to be a teacher of the school for the handicapped I/II (Omnibus), Teaching Practicum, Research Project
- Note: Kanazawa University generally operates on a quarter system, and each course is 1 credit.
- (2) Graduate School of Professional Development in Education Courses: Practical

Research on Inclusive Education (2 credits); Conference on Inclusive Education I (2 credits); Conference on Inclusive Education II (2 credits); Understanding and Addressing Developmental Disabilities (2 credits, Omnibus)

- *Additional common undergraduate courses may be assigned.
- *Kanazawa University's School of Teacher Education has a Joint Teacher Training Program with the University of Toyama, and some courses may be taken by students from the University of Toyama.
- *Some courses listed in (1) and (2) may be conducted in English.

5. **Qualifications**:

Applicants must meet all of the following conditions (1) through (5). Condition (6) is desirable but not mandatory:

- (1) Holding a doctoral degree (a doctoral degree having been awarded by April 2026 at the latest) or the qualifications equivalent to PhD
- (2) An applicant's nationality does not affect the selection. However, the candidate must be able to conduct classes, advise students, complete administrative tasks, contribute to committee works, and perform other necessary work in Japanese.
- (3) Residence in Kanazawa or surrounding cities after employment.
- (4) Being passionate about teacher education and having a strong devotion to education and the community.
- (5) A proven track record of obtaining scientific research grants, academic research funding, and other public research funds.
- (6) Applicants must hold a teaching license for kindergarten, elementary school, junior high school, high school, or special-needs school and possess teaching experience (including part-time teaching) at one of these levels.

Note. In accordance with Article 8 of the **Equal Employment Opportunity Law** (special provisions regarding measures for female workers), this open recruitment is limited to female applicants as a transitional measure to proactively address the significant underrepresentation of female faculty members.

- (5) Statement on the applicant's prospective research and education at School of Teacher Education (approximately 1000 characters in Japanese or 600 words in English)
