

Announcement of Full-Time Position
Faculty of Law
Kanazawa University

1. **Number of positions:** One Professor ,Associate Professor (tenured) or Lecturer (five-year fixed-term contract*)

*The term of Lecturer is set for 5 years at the time of employment. (If you are currently working at our university and work continuously, the total term of office, from the current term to the next term, cannot exceed 10 years.) The candidate will be converted to adequate tenured status, based on the following achievements, which is to be implemented during the term.

- (1) Educational achievements (Lecture, Practicum, Seminar, Research guidance, etc.)
- (2) Research achievements (Research papers, Presentations at conferences, Research grants)
- (3) Contribution to the university and society, and so on

2. **Affiliation:**

- (1) Research body: Faculty of Law
- (2) Educational body: School of Law and Graduate School of Law

*You will have to participate in (cooperative) research projects in the field of political science.

3. **Field of specialization:** Civil Law (Law of Obligation, Contract Law, Tort Law)

4. **Subjects to Teach:**

- General Education Division: Lectures and seminars
- School of Law: Civil Law and other lectures and seminars
- Graduate School of Law(Master's Course): Civil Law and other lectures and seminars

*You may be assigned to teach courses in the Law School.

5. **Qualifications:**

All of the following requirements must be fulfilled:

- (1) A doctoral degree awarded by the time of the commencement of employment (or an equivalent qualification can be considered).
- (2) An applicant of any nationality can be considered. It is desirable for candidates

to possess sufficient communication skills in both Japanese and English.

(3) Residence in Kanazawa or surrounding cities after employment.

6. **Deadline for application:** February 27th, 2026

7. **Commencement of employment:** October 1st, 2026 (or the earliest possible date thereafter)

8. **Application documents:**

(1) Curriculum vitae : With photo and detailed description of your academic and professional back-ground starting from the graduation from university(including a list of research achievements, the information of peer-reviewed articles, the details of research grants). E-mail address is also required.

(2) Teaching portfolio (if applicable).

(3) Offprints or copies of three of the applicant's major research related books/articles. Reference to the order of significance is required. Attach a Japanese summary of 400 letters to each offprint or copy. An English summary of 300 words in length is also acceptable.

(4) Teaching plan :

Syllabus for Law of Obligation A and Law of Obligation B or Syllabus for Source of Obligations (Contract)A Source of Obligations (Torts)B and (in Japanese and English, 16weeks, with introduction in week 1 and final exam in week 16) .

9. **Selection process:**

The selection will be based on the submitted documents. After the initial screening, short-listed candidates may be called for an interview and be asked to give a teaching demonstration. Travel costs (including overseas travel) for the interview will not be covered.

10. **Contact:**

Please apply through the JREC-IN web portal. In that case, you can only submit one file through the portal, so you will need to combine documents into a single file.

* You can send your published work. Submitted documents will not be returned unless requested. Applicants who wish to have their documents returned must enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope.
